Focus

It struck me recently that despite the impact that Jesus had on the world, at the time of his birth, virtually nobody knew about him. Consider this – that the most important and significant birth in all history, was known about by maybe a dozen people and no more. There was of course Mary and Joseph, there were the shepherds and the wise men (although we don't know how many of either of them there were), we know that Mary's cousin Elizabeth – and presumably her husband Zechariah – also knew. We know that the innkeeper was told of Mary's pregnancy and no doubt knew that the birth occurred in the stable shortly after their arrival. Herod was told of the expected birth by the wise men and of course his advisors would have been brought into that conversation. And that is about it. I'm sure that Mary's and Joseph's friends and families also knew but we have no record of those and of course the sharing of the news amongst them may have been limited given the unusual circumstances of Mary's pregnancy.

But no matter how many people knew about this, for such an ep-

ochal event, it is a surprisingly small and in some ways overwhelming audience. It is possible of course that the amazing events that occurred may have attracted attention from other people. The star that the wise men followed would have been seen by anyone who looked into the night sky, guests at the inn may have known that a young mother had had her child in the stable, it is even possible that the glorious angelic choir was seen by more people than the shepherds – after all any sudden manifestation of such supernatural wonder would be bound to attract some observers. But when all is said and done, considering that this is the very beginning of a whole new chapter in human history, it is a pretty small sample of the human race that is made aware of the dawn of this new age.

So why were so few included? Why was the news broadcast to such small groups of people? And why would someone who posed such a threat to the young child (Herod) be told about the news?

Well we know that despite the fact that these people were very clearly aware of the birth, in most

cases they were asked directly, or instinctively felt, that it was the right thing to do to keep this news under wraps. Joseph and Mary were individually spoken to by angels and in both cases they remained silent and went about their business discretely and quietly. The wise men were asked to go home via a different route and not meet with Herod again. Only the shepherds seemed unable to contain their excitement – they spread the news far and wide.

Why is this so? Well the obvious answer is that it was perhaps part of God's great plan that he did not want the rich, powerful and potentially dangerous to know about the baby at this early stage in his life on earth. It was news that was broadcast *to* the ordinary people *by* the ordinary people (the shepherds).

But if we look at the whole of Jesus's life on this earth then maybe we begin to see the full picture. It was not until Jesus was baptised in the Jordan when he was much older that he became empowered by the Holy Spirit and was able to embark on His ministry. So for around thirty years the Son of God was living



on this earth as an ordinary, vulnerable human being and it was only when he was filled with the Spirit that He was

transformed from being the son of a man with ordinary natural abilities into The Son of Man, filled with the power of Almighty

God, able at last to fulfil His ministry.

But now of course, seeing the full picture, we know that because of His ministry, and because of His death & resurrection, and then because of the work of the apostles, the good news of the Messiah has become known throughout the world. It is a big contrast with that tiny number of people who were first told the news. What a testament to the great power of the Holy Spirit in building up the church! What an amazing demonstration

of the power of Almighty God to build up His people from the most modest of beginnings.

We often say that the birth of Jesus brought hope and light to a dark world, and perhaps looking at such a modest start in life, we see another aspect of that light and hope. The Saviour of the world has come and although He arrived as a helpless babe with little fanfare, he reigns now at *this* Christmas time as a Mighty King, The Prince Of Peace. What a glorious Saviour!
